In life, He bore to us Your message; in death He pronounced forgiveness; in raising Him, You declared victory over sin and death.

On the night He was given up for us, our Lord Jesus gathered with his disciples in the upper room. And there at the table, He took a loaf and having given thanks to God he broke it and gave it to them saying, "Take, eat, this is my body which is to be given up for you."

And after supper, likewise, He took a chalice, and giving thanks to God He gave it to them saying, "Take and drink, for this is my blood of the new covenant poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins."

As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup we do show forth the death of Christ until He comes again.
